HEALTH & SAFETY PART 1 & 2 5 Day Program

COST \$699.00- INCLUDES LUNCH EACH DAY

Public Services Health & Safety Association

Certification Part One for Joint Health and Safety Committees; Three Days

This program is the first part of the training process for individuals to be certified under guidelines established and enforced by the Ontario Ministry of Labour. Workplaces with 20 or more regular employees must have at least two personnel who have completed the certification training.

Upon completion of Certification Part One, participants will understand the relevant legislation as well as their legal rights and responsibilities.

Participants will also learn about common workplace hazards and key steps to addressing these hazards. This knowledge will prepare participants to carry out workplace inspections and accident investigations, and enable them to function effectively as JHSC member certification.

Part Two Fire Workplace Hazard Specific for JHSC; Two Days

As the second part of the JHSC certification process, Sector Specific Certification assists JHSC members with issues to their work environment. To complete Certification Part Two, both management and worker members of the JHSC must receive training in the significant hazards found in their workplace. Upon completion of Certification Part Two, participants will be able to identify the hazards commonly found in fire services, and describe how they may cause injury or illness. The program will enable participants to effectively recognize and assess these sector specific hazards, as well as outline methods for controlling them. Participants will also learn about relevant legislation, standards and guidelines.

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Apparatus with Fire Pump Train the Trainer 5 Day Program

COST \$200.00- INCLUDES LUNCH EACH DAY

Apparatus Equipped with a Fire Pump (Pump Ops) program meets the knowledge and skill requisites established by the NFPA 1002 Standard for Fire Apparatus Driver – Operator Professional Qualifications Chapter 5, 2014 Edition.

This course will cover the job performance requirements that shall be met under NFPA 1002 Chapter 5, 2014 Edition. Upon successful completion of this course each student will understand and be able to demonstrate the operation of a fire department pumper from both a static and pressurized source of water.

Provincial testing through Academic Standards and Evaluation with the Office of the Fire Marshal and Emergency Management will be available at the conclusion of the course for students wishing to receive certification.

Prerequisites: NFPA 1001 Fire Fighter I or NFPA 1001 Fire Fighter I Recruit, and a valid DZ License. Proof of a valid DZ License must be presented to the Instructor at the commencement of the class.

Students that fail to provide the proper documentation
will not be eligible to attend the class.

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First Aid- CPR Level HCP Certification 2 Day Program

Course Information:

Standard First Aid - CPR Level HCP (Health Care Provider)

This course is for individuals who are working or plan to work in the Health Care field and require the Health Care Provider level of CPR. The course includes all CPR skills plus advanced skills such as artificial respiration and use of bag valve masks and AEDs. Provincially recognized certificate which meets WSIB and Canadian Labour Code certification, valid for three years, is issued upon successful completion.

CPR Level HCP (Health Care Provider)

CPR for Health Care Providers (HCP) is specifically designed for the current and future Nursing, Health and Emergency Care Service Providers. Topics covered include cardiovascular and respiratory emergencies, adult, child and infant CPR skills, two-rescuer CPR, automated external defibrillation (AED), use of the bag valve mask, rescue breathing and jaw thrust, anatomy and physiology and infection control. Each student will receive a St. John Ambulance First Aid Reference Guide with over 400 pages of information, full colour illustrations, charts, glossary and more. This course is a recognized prerequisite for post-secondary health and emergency service training programs. Provincially recognized certificates are issued upon completion. Annual retraining in CPR is recommended

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FORIBLE ENTRY ALL HANDS ON 1 Day Program

INSTRUCTOR ANDREW BRASSARD: In 2006, Andrew was one of two Milton Firefighters who received both the Ontario Medal for Firefighter Bravery and the MSA Fireslayer of the Year Award for Heroism for his role in saving the life of a civilian.

Rotation 1- Conventional Forcible Entry

Inward and outward doors, Size Up, Wood doors, limited and zero visibility

Rotation 2- Through the Lock, Padlocks, hinge side

Each Student will pull lock cylinders, learn about mortise and rim locks. Students will break padlocks in a few different ways, learn about lock construction and how to force a door from the hinge side.

Rotation 3- Saws

Students will practice cutting simulated window bars, saw set up and maintenance. Cut locks, Various heights and simulated fortified doors.

Rotation 4- Window Bars

Proper use of the halligan and hook, garage doors, bolt shearing, driving bolts through the door.
